(Pocket money/The Ten Commandments and the rules for them to live) (ch.21 v.1-17, ch.31 v.18)

What did Israelites say they would do with the law? (Do everything the LORD had said/Ignore it completely)

How did the Israelites respond to seeing God's mighty power? (They ran onto the mountain celebrating/They trembled with fear, and stayed at a distance) (ch.20 v.18)


- What did the Israelites do as soon as they were hungry and thirsty? (Hint: ch.16 v.2)

- ➤ What did God do for them despite their grumbling? (Hint: ch.16 v.12, ch.17 v.6)
- ➤ What was the most important thing that God gave to Israel, something He gave to Moses on Mount Sinai? (Hint: ch.20)


We see the importance of God's law by what God has said, and done, in Exodus. God rescued Israel out of Egypt in order to have a relationship with God and worship him. He showed them signs so powerful and scary that the Israelites trembled with fear. And God spoke directly to Moses – revealing his law. But also, we get a good idea from what God had already said to them in ch.15 v.26. God told them that if they did what God said, and obeyed his commands, God would not bring on them any of the bad things that happened to Egypt, but would bless them instead.

Let's praise God that though we fail, just like Israel, we have a saviour - Jesus, who fulfilled the law for us, so that we can have relationship with God through Jesus. But also, we get a good idea from what God had already said to them in ch.15 v.26:

"If you listen carefully to the Lord your God and do what is right in his eyes, if you pay attention to his commands and keep all his decrees, I will not bring on you any of the diseases I brought on the Egyptians, for I am the Lord, who heals you."

The Israelites were to obey The LORD so that they could keep in right relationship with him, and so that they wouldn't be under God's curse – like the Egyptians.

Let's praise God that though we fail like Israel, we have a saviour - Jesus, who fulfilled the law for us, so that we can have relationship with God through Jesus.
